1. **Authority:** The Event is held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport Australia, the Motorkhana Standing Regulations, This Event will be conducted with the Supplementary Regulations, and any Further Regulations issued by the club.

The Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Safety 1st, Integrity and Legal, and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au.

This Event will be known as **Club Motorkhana – Round 3** hereafter referred to as The Event.

10. Entries

- a) Maximum number of entries for the Event: 40 Reserves: 5
- b) Maximum number of Drivers per vehicle is four (4)
- c) Opening Date: Sunday 7th July 2024
- d) Closing Date: 5:00 pm Monday 5th August 2024
- e) Entries will be accepted in order of receipt and must be lodged via the Motorsport Australia Event Entry system along with payment of the appropriate fee by online credit card payment or direct deposit to the Organising Club.
- f) Entries from people under 18 years of age must be counter-signed/consented by a Parent or Legal Guardian.
- g) If an entrant advises the Event Secretary that they are unable to attend The Event, the following procedure regarding a refund applies:
If entrant advises the Event Secretary five days or more prior to the event the refund will be, fee paid - \$20,00 administration fee at the discretion of the Event Secretary. A full refund will apply to juniors.
- h) Entries may be refused in accordance with the NCR.

11. Tests

As per the Motorsport Australia Motorkhana Standing Regulations. Drivers will be advised of the selected tests before the event.

12. Minimum licences

Adult drivers must have a Motorsport Australia current Speed or superior Motorsport Australia licence.

Junior drivers must have a Speed Junior or superior Motorsport Australia licence.

All drivers must have a current membership with a Motorsport Australia affiliated club.

Licence currency and club membership will be verified electronically prior to The Event. There will be no face to face registration for the Event on the day.

13. Driver Safety

- a) Maximum Speed 80 Kph on the competition surface, walking pace elsewhere at the Event venue.
- b) All apparel shall comply with Schedule D of the Motorsport Australia Manual.
 - 1. Minimum of short sleeve shirt/t-shirt and short pants.
 - 2. Enclosed shoes (thongs, open sandals, and high-heeled shoes are forbidden).
 - 3. A helmet is not mandatory except for Drivers of Motorkhana Specials. If a helmet is worn, it is required to meet the Motorsport Australia Manual Schedule D and AS1698 standard.

14 Juniors

Junior drivers (i.e. not less than 12 years and under 18 years of age as off the date of the event) will be required to carry a parent or guardian as a passenger (Observer) until the Clerk of the Course is satisfied with their driving capabilities.

That parent or guardian must be the person who signed giving consent for the junior on their Motorsport Australia disclaimer form.

15. Vehicle Check Requirements Basic vehicle safety check

- a) All vehicles shall comply with Schedule A and Group 4H of the Motorsport Australia Manual.
- b) Vehicles to be in a roadworthy condition.
- c) Maximum noise limit: 95 dba at 30 metres.
Any car found to exceed the maximum noise emission limit will be suspended from the Event until the Clerk of the Course is satisfied that action has been taken to bring it within the limit.
- d) Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the Motorsport Australia Manual.
- e) Electric Vehicles will not be accepted at this Event.

16. Scrutiny Check

A self-scrutiny vehicle safety check must be performed by the competitor and driver using the Self-Scrutiny Checklist - Autotest. The Self Scrutiny Checklist form and the Event Entry Self-Scrutiny Statement of Vehicle Compliance (TSP03EE) scrutineering declaration must be completed, signed and returned to the Event S

Please note that Scrutineers will conduct spot checks throughout the day.

17. Drivers Briefing

There will be a short pre-event drivers' briefing at 8:45am in front of the shelter shed beside the skidpan. Comprehensive drivers briefing notes will also be distributed electronically to all competitors prior to the event

18. Event Schedule

Start time: **9:00 am** Finish time: **4:00 pm.**

19. Authority of officials

Any Competitor not following a reasonable instruction by an official during the Event may be excluded from the event.

20. Insurance

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the Event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at www.motorsport.org.au.

21. Protests

Must be lodged in accordance with the NCR.

22. Postponement/abandonment/cancellation

The Organiser reserves the right to abandon, postpone or stop the Event in accordance with the NCR.

23. Integrity

Smoking (which includes e-cigarettes and "vaping") and any naked flame is prohibited within 3 metres of any refuelling/defueling operation.
Motorsport Australia's National Integrity Framework and any associated policy (including the Australian Anti-Doping Policy. Motorsport Australia's Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing)

Policy, the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy), apply to any activity authorised by Motorsport Australia as published at www.motorsport.org.au. Any Participant including the holder of a Motorsport Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol, an Australian drug or other banned substance. In addition to any penalty imposed by Motorsport Australia, a further penalty/s may be applied by Sport Integrity Australia. Consumption of alcohol in any Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day.

25. Additions and/or alterations

Any additions and/or alterations to these Supplementary Regulations will be notified to all entrants in Final Regulations or via email prior to the Event.

26. Vehicles

All vehicles participating in the event must meet the requirements set out in the Event Entry Self-Scrutiny Statement of Vehicle Compliance (TSP03EE) and Self Check List Auto Test (available through the MSA Event Entry System)

Open Wheeler, single seater type vehicles or Motorkhana specials are not permitted without the prior approval of the Event Secretary or the Clerk of Course.

27. Passengers

The Event will include a Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the Motorsport Australia MSPRA Policy.

Passengers are allowed to accompany a driver as a trainer or an observer. This Event will have Instructors in vehicles.

A passenger Ride Entry Form must be completed by **all passengers** and returned to the event secretary via email, eventsec@mx5.com.au, prior to the event.

At no time are passengers allowed to drive the vehicle unless they have entered the Event and have the appropriate licensing. Only one passenger is allowed in any vehicle while the vehicle is being driven on the skidpan.

Juniors can only be passengers in a car with their parent/guardian or an adult that cohabits with them, e.g., a sibling over 18 years of age.

There is no penalty for a driver that carries a passenger (The driver will be eligible to score points in the MX-5 Club Championship).

Note: Passengers must wear the same safety apparel as the driver, which is appropriate for the class the vehicle is being competed in. The passenger must be restrained as required for each Automobile with consideration for their physical attributes. Vehicles shall only carry one Passenger at a time.
