



SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

NSW STATE CHAMPIONSHIP MOTORKHANA – Round 7

1. This event will be “**NSW State Motorkhana Round 7**” hereafter referred to as “**The Event**”

Authority: The Event will be conducted under FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR), the National Motorkhana Code (NMC). This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with any and all necessary Motorsport Australia COVID-19 Return to Race strategy requirements, the NSW Motorkhana Addendum, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations which may be issued.

This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Motorsport Australia Safety 1st and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au .

10. **Event Schedule:** Start time: 9:30 am Finish time: 4:00pm

11. **Entry Fee:** Adults - \$100.00 Juniors - \$50.00

12. Competitions

The Event will include both NSW Motorkhana and MX-5 Club Motorkhana competitions.

- a) All entrants will compete in the NSW Motorkhana competition.
- b) An entrant who is an MX-5 Club member as at the date of the event, and who competes in a Mazda MX-5, will also be a MX-5 Club Motorkhana competitor and eligible to score points in the MX-5 Club Motorkhana Championship..

13. Entries

- a) Maximum number of entries for the Event: 60 Reserves: 5
- b) Opening Date: 22/05/2024
- c) Closing Date: 25/06/2024
- d) Entries are open to all members of Motorsport Australia affiliated car clubs.
- e) Entries must be lodged on the event entry form with the event secretary via the Motorsport Australia Event Entry. Event entry is only via Motorsport Australia Event Entry.
- f) Entries will not be accepted on the day.
- g) Entries from people under 18 years of age must be counter-signed/consented by a parent or legal guardian.
- h) Maximum number of drivers per vehicle is four. (4).
- i) If an entrant advises the event secretary that he/she is unable to attend the event, a request for a refund can be made through the "member portal" on the Motorsport Australia Website. A refund will be at the discretion of the Event Organiser.
- j) Entries may be refused in accordance with the NCR's of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.
- k) Competition numbers shall be allocated at the discretion of the Event Secretary in order of receipt.

14. Tests

Minimum of 6 tests as per motorkhana code. Two runs at each test will be made available to each driver, with their fastest time for each test used in the results.

Drivers will be advised of the selected tests before the event starts.

15. Minimum licences

Drivers must have a current Motorsport Australia Speed Licence or Junior Speed Licence (or superior) and a current membership of a Motorsport Australia affiliated car club. Licence currency will be verified electronically prior to the Event. Drivers must present a Motorsport Australia car log book (if issued) for stamping by the Chief Scrutineer.

16. Juniors

Junior drivers (i.e. not less than 12 years and under 18 years of age as of the date of the event) will be required to carry a parent or guardian as a passenger ("Observer") until the Clerk of the Course is satisfied with their driving competence. That parent or guardian must be the person who signed giving consent for the junior on their Motorsport Australia disclaimer form. A parent or guardian must be present on the day for the duration of the Event.

17. Scrutineering

Start time: 8:00 am Finish time: 9.30 am Location general car park.

There will be no pre-event scrutineering at the Event. The Self Scrutiny Checklist form and the Event Entry Self- Scrutiny Statement of Vehicle Compliance (TSP03EE) scrutineering declaration must be completed online as part of the pre-event documentation and emailed to the Event Secretary.

A self- scrutiny vehicle safety check must be performed at the circuit prior to the competition by the competitor and driver using the Self- Scrutiny Checklist.

Please note that scrutineers will conduct spot checks through the day.

Start time: 8:00 am

- a) Location: General car park
- b) All apparel shall comply with Schedule D of the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport
- c) A helmet is not mandatory except for drivers of Motorkhana Specials. Where a helmet is worn it must comply with Schedule D of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.
- d) All cars must comply with Schedule A and Group 4H of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.
- e) Cars must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions.
- f) Any camera or video recording device mounted in or on a competition vehicle must be approved by the Chief Scrutineer. Cameras mounted on specials or on the exterior of other vehicles must have a secondary restraint if the primary mount is by suction cup(s).

18. Classes

NSW Motorkhana Classes:

- Class A Production Vehicles Wheelbase up to 2150mm
- Class B Production Vehicles Wheelbase 2151 to 2390mm
- Class C Production Vehicles Wheelbase 2391 to 2574mm
- Class D Production Vehicles Wheelbase 2575mm and over.
- Class F Front Wheel Drive Specials
- Class G Rear Wheel Drive Specials
- Class H Production Vehicle Based Specials
- Class E 4wd/Awd production.

Motorkhana Categories:

- (Nomination in a category does not preclude a driver from competing for class awards)
- Category J Juniors
- Category LP Ladies in Production Vehicles
- Category LS Ladies in Specials

MX-5 Club Motorkhana Classes:

- Open
- Ladies

19. Results, Prizes and Trophies

Results shall be determined by the lowest aggregate of elapsed times on the tests completed, inclusive of penalties. Timing shall be to 0.01 second.

1st Outright, 1st in each Class (minimum 3 entries in Class), 1st in each Category (minimum 3 entries in Category). All awards are mutually exclusive.

20. Drivers' Briefing

Comprehensive driver briefing notes will be distributed electronically to all drivers prior to the event. A short driver briefing will be conducted on the day.

21. Authority of officials

Any competitor not following a reasonable instruction by an official during the Event may be excluded.

All Officials will be Judges of Fact in accordance with National Motorkhana Standing Regulations and the NCR's. The names of those officials are available from the event administrator on request at the event.

22. Insurance

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the event. Further details can be found in the MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA Insurance Handbook, available at www.MotorsportAustralia.com.au.

23. Start and Finish

Procedures shall be in accordance with Article 13 of the National Motorkhana Standing Regulations. Running order shall be at the discretion of the Clerk of Course.

24. Protests

Any protest must be in accordance with the NCR's.

25. Postponement / abandonment / cancellation.

The organisers reserve the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the Event in accordance with the NCR's of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.

26. Alcohol, Drugs and Other Substances

The holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of any drug or other banned substance and subject to a penalty for a breach of the Australian National Anti-Doping Policy and /or the Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy at www.motorsport.org.au

Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any other Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day. The holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy at www.motorsport.org.au

27. Refreshment facilities

None at venue. The nearest shopping area is on Douglas Road in Quakers Hill.

28. Fuel

Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport. Fuel is not available at the venue.

The nearest fuel is at the BP Service Station, 45 Hambledon Rd, Quakers Hill.

29. Additions and/or alterations.

Any additions and/or alterations to these Supplementary Regulations will be notified to all entrants in Further Regulations or during the Drivers' Briefing.

30. Passengers

The Event will include a Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the Motorsport Australia MSPRA Policy.

Other than when the driver is a junior, a passenger is allowed to accompany a driver only as a trainer or an observer.

At no time are passengers allowed to drive the vehicle unless they have entered The Event and have the appropriate licensing. Only one passenger is allowed in any vehicle while the vehicle is being driven on the skidpan. Juniors can only be passengers in a car with their parent/guardian or an adult that cohabits with them, e.g., a sibling over 18 years of age.

As per MSPRA Policy all Passengers must complete a Passenger Ride Entry form available from officials on the day.

Note: Passengers must wear the same safety apparel as the driver which is appropriate for the class the vehicle is being competed in. The passenger must be restrained as required for each Automobile with consideration for their physical attributes. Vehicles shall only carry one Passenger at a time.

31. Damage to equipment

The organisers reserve the right to recover the cost (including shipping charges) of any equipment damaged (excluding flags and their bases) from any entrant or driver who damages that equipment during the course of the event, whether this be deliberate or accidental.
